NOTE ON CASTING

All performers are volunteers; seeking actors 18+. Please note that select roles will be filled by members of the Friends of George's Company. All remaining roles will be cast through the audition process as we continue to grow our artistic family.

Friends of George's is a drag-centric theatre company dedicated to celebrating the artistry, creativity, and joy of drag while producing bold, hilarious, and heartfelt theatrical entertainment that benefits our community.

We encourage performers who love drag - whether experienced artists or those excited to perform in drag for the first time - to audition. Casting is based on talent,

characterization, and the needs of the production, regardless of gender identity, gender expression, sex, race, ethnicity, age, body type, or previous drag experience. We welcome performers of all backgrounds who are eager to embrace the camp, theatricality, and joyful spirit of this production.

Our rehearsal room is built on respect, collaboration, and inclusivity. We are committed to providing an environment where every artist feels welcomed, valued, and empowered to do their best work.

ROLES:

Please note the following roles have been filled with Friends of George's company members: **Joan Crawford** (filled by Micah Winter-Cole); **Chiquitita** (filled by David Winter-Gutierrez); and **Bette Davis** (filled by Burton Bridges)

Christina Crawford *If this were a Muppet movie, she would be the only human.*

Warm, sweet, and the emotional glue of the piece, though she often looks like she's two seconds from packing a small suitcase and fleeing to a convent. The heart of the show, if the heart had PTSD and an unpaid therapy bill.

Fernando *Also one of Joan's dumb and f*ckable houseboys.*

"Almost too gay to function," but hadn't noticed. Sparks fly with Chiquitita once they realize they've been tragically misunderstanding each other—and sexuality—this whole time. Together, they form one whole brain cell and an unstoppable love story.

Eartha Kitt *Sultry. Slinky. Slightly supernatural.*

Could kill you with one look—and you'd thank her. She doesn't walk, she slithers, and every syllable that leaves her lips is dipped in satin, sass, and subtle threat. Equal parts siren, villainess, and jazz cabaret smoke. Has never once experienced self-doubt, a bad angle, or an unflattering spotlight.

(Think Jujubee's Snatch Game portrayal.)

Judy Garland *Icon. Legend. Liquored up.*

This is Judy toward the end of her hard life—equal parts diva, darling, and disaster—but the kind you can't look away from. The house may crumble, the men may leave, the studio may call her “difficult,” but she'll still show up in sequins and sing like her rent and soul depend on it.

(Think Jinkx Monsoon's Snatch Game portrayal.)

Liza Minnelli *Chaos ex machina.*

Chaos incarnate with a Liza twist—equal parts razzle, dazzle, and “where am I again?” A living sequin with legs that kick higher than her sense of direction. She may not know what room she's in, what scene this is, or who half the cast are, but she's thrilled to be here and doing Fosse choreography about it. Infectiously joyful, wildly unpredictable, and somehow always on beat—even when she's not on script.

Ensemble + Swings + Understudies

Additional ensemble performers will be cast for featured group numbers and scenes. Swings and understudies will also be selected to ensure coverage for principal and ensemble roles throughout the production.
